

AT MT. ZION

Happy 159th Anniversary Mt. Zion



The 159th anniversary of Mt. Zion Congregational Church, United Church of Christ holds historical and cultural significance. Founded in 1864, the church has been a pillar of the African American community and a center for social and spiritual growth. Its long history reflects the resilience and strength of the congregation in the face of racial adversity and challenges. The anniversary celebrates the church's

contributions to the spiritual, social, and cultural fabric of the community, as well as its ongoing commitment to faith, justice, and unity.

The year 1864 was a significant juncture in American history, marked by a tumultuous period of the Civil War and the ongoing struggle for African Americans' rights and freedom. As the nation grappled with the deep-rooted issues of slavery and racial inequality, African Americans played pivotal roles in shaping the course of history, both on and off the battlefield. In spite of the fact that enslaved African Americans were searching to find their way in a country that never embraced them, Mt. Zion Congregational Church became the first Congregational church organized by and for African Americans in the state of Ohio.

"Developed on June 8, 1864 out of a prayer group led by Edward Woodliff, a member of Shiloh Baptist Church,

Woodliff and other brave Shiloh members formed Mt. Zion. They had a hope for an unknown future, but yet, a future nestled in the strength of their Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The former members of Shiloh decided, after much discussion, that the Congregational order best suited their religious needs. This was largely due to the many abolishionists who were members of the Congregational church at that time. With guidance and encouragement from local Congregational churches, formal organization of Mt. Zion took place at Plymouth Congregational Church on September 11, 1864. Rev. J. H. Muse was appointed the first minister and a building was erected at Erie (E. 9th) St. and Webster Ave. Subsequent moves included occupation of church buildings at Maple (E. 31st) St., E. 55th St. and Central Ave (in a structure formerly occupied by the Temple, 1928), 9014 Cedar Ave (1938), and the YMCA. In 1954, members of Mt. Zion

purchased the Grandin Mansion on Magnolia Avenue near University Circle, to erect a new modern brick edifice. Although the property was bombed soon afterward, the congregation resolved to remain and a new sanctuary at 10723 Magnolia Avenue was dedicated on September 30, 1956."

Over its long history, Mt. Zion Congregational Church has witnessed and been a part of various historical events, cultural shifts, and social changes. It has played a role in advocating for civil rights, supporting community development initiatives, and providing a safe haven for African Americans during challenging times. The church's commitment to faith, justice, and unity, as well as its ability to adapt and evolve over the years, underscores its significance as an institution that has helped shape the narrative of African American history and progress in Cleveland and beyond.

Woodliff and the other forward thinking founders of Mt. Zion Congregational Church would be proud of their legacy.

John P. Green site is at Section 49 to your right after entering from Quincy gate. (Near green port-a-potty)


